Our P6/7's are getting extra coaching at Monikie P.S. from Active Schools Co-ordinator, Emma Thomas, before the Basketball Festival on the 20th February at Carnoustie Leisure Centre.

Emma is also busy doing Young Leaders training with our P6/7's to help them organise games and activities when in the playground. The children will also be beginning to take on extra responsibilities as monitors, answering the phone at breaktimes etc. These developments tie in nicely with the introduction of Bounceback which is a programme promoting resilience and respect which I will be covering at assemblies. This will be in conjunction with Restorative Practices which is a focus in our School Improvement Plan. On Thursday 3rd April the P4-7 class will be taking part in an Anti-Bullying Workshop at the school for the whole morning.

The P7's are at Carnoustie High School this morning as part of their transition programme. They return again on Friday 14th March to do drama transition workshops.

On Thursday 13th March we are to hold an Open Morning from 10 – 11am. Our theme will be on Literacy and we have changed it to a morning time so the Nursery can be included. You are all welcome to visit the nursery even though your child is no longer there, the staff and children would love to see you.

In the next few weeks we intend starting up some paired reading in the school. This involves older children reading along with younger children. They have a question and answer session and research shows the exercise benefits the older as well as the younger. You will get a leaflet home explaining more about it once we have given the children some training.

We are also going to change the way we issue homework. Your child will get home a grid with different challenges in each square. These grids will be differentiated according to your child's appropriate level of learning. They will concur with the work being done in the class. Your child will have several weeks to complete his/her grid. This will allow for you to plan when is best to complete the homework as we are aware many children have extra-curricular activities in the evenings and other demands put upon them. Please be assured that reading and spelling will still be sent home on a regular basis. As always, we welcome your support with this new venture and I will be consulting with you for feedback once we have trialled this approach.


