MINUTE OF MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 20TH MARCH, AT 6.15PM

Kathryn opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and advising of a slight change to the Agenda, starting with a Head Teacher's Report.

Head Teacher's Report

<u>Staffing Changes</u> – Lesley outlined the changes to be implemented after the Easter holidays. Alison Duffus will be coming out of class, with P1/3 being taught by Joyce Gray on a Monday and Tuesday, and Gemma O'Neill Wednesday – Friday. Miss O'Neill has been coming in on a Wednesday since January to work in the P1/3 class, so the children already know her. Miss Duffus will be supporting the learning & teaching at both Monikie & Newbigging.

The above is the situation initially until the summer holidays. Lesley is still waiting for her staffing allocation from Angus Council for next session.

Marilyn Fraser, class teacher at Monikie School, has been appointed Acting Principal Teacher of both schools. She will be supporting the new class teachers and will have responsibility for transition and raising attainment in the Early Years.

Diane expressed the opinion that the changes are a positive thing as, with Newbigging only having 2 classes, it is good for teachers to be able to get a change.

Stephen McKomskie will continue to come into the school in the long term.

<u>Inspection</u> – Lesley advised that there has still been no word of a date for an inspection, although we have been told that it would be soon. Questionnaires will be issued to parents and parents will also be invited in to speak to the Lay Inspector.

<u>Playground</u> — our Active Schools Co-ordinator, Emma Thomas, has been training P6/7 pupils for playground duties. Recently there have been one or two incidents which have given cause for concern, so playground supervision is being reinstated. Supervision will be covered by Lesley, Anne and Stephen, with children being restricted to the front of the school, and children will continue with their roles of play leaders. Assemblies will focus on inclusion.

Angus Council is still chasing up the company hired to mark out a netball court. Although there are other companies who provide this service, the firm that was awarded the contracted provide the best quality.

A grant application to the Lottery Fund has been successful, which will allow us to get various games marked out on the playground.

Lesley asked that if parents have any issues with the school, that they email or phone Lesley rather than talk about it with other parents at the school gates.

<u>PA System</u> – Lesley thanked Paul and Jane Donaldson for supplying a PA system to the school. The system includes microphones and extremely large speakers!

<u>Valentines Disco</u> – the feedback from children is that they loved the disco. Lesley asked if a plan could be made up for events – who does what, eg music/prizes/games. Members of the Parent Council usually know each other's roles as they stay in touch via emails before events. In future, Lesley and the school will be included in these emails too so everyone is informed. Getting a plan drawn up will go on the Agenda for the next meeting. Kathryn suggested that, rather than limiting it to Parent Council members, we should try to include as many parents as possible.

<u>Usborne Books</u> – Newbigging School's sales figures were added to Monikie's to give us a better rate of commission. We will receive £23 worth of Usborne books.

<u>Football</u> — pupils recently took part in the Rural Schools Football Tournament at Pitskelly Park in Carnoustie. A lovely afternoon was had and the children enjoyed taking part. They were a credit to the school.

<u>Assembly</u> – certificates are being awarded to children at assembly time to show that we recognise when they are doing well. Any member of staff can nominate a child that they feel deserves a mention.

<u>Open Morning</u> – Lesley thanked everyone for coming. It was a lovely morning and the comments left by visitors were very positive.

Easter Service – our Easter Service will be held at 11am on Tuesday 1st April.

Anti-Bullying – workshops will be held for P4/7 pupils on Thursday 3rd April.

Talent Contest - Newbigging School has teamed up with Monikie Primary School to hold a talent contest. Auditions will be held on Friday 25th April, with staff deciding which acts should go through to the final on Friday 2nd May at 2pm, at Monikie & Newbigging Church. Each class will also be performing.

Visit - Pauline Stephen, Head of Schools and Learning, will be visiting the school on Tuesday 27th May.

Vandalism – Gillian asked what had been done about the recent vandalism in the nursery garden. Lesley advised that the police had visited the school and that she had visited a few of the neighbours to see if anyone heard or No-one saw anything but some neighbours have had problems with young people visiting the village at weekends. The question of installing CCTV was raised. The police had advised that installing CCTV in a public area was a minefield and that they didn't recommend it. Sensor lights are installed and these come on during darkness if anyone breaks the sensor.

<u>Golf Lessons</u> – Paul advised that the golf professional had not received the forms from Angus Council, and that the process should start again.

Cookbook – this was a successful fundraiser in the run up to Christmas, with £88 being raised.

<u>Crossing Patrol</u> – Lesley spoke to Craig Smith at Angus Council. Cars are still going too fast through the village. The Parent Council will have to campaign for improvement to the crossing. Gillian will get in touch with her contact within Angus Council's Transport Department, Andy Barnes.
